Joint IMS/LMS Meeting, May 1998

This joint meeting with the London Mathematical Society was devoted to the topic *Complex Analysis and Dynamical Systems*. There were six speakers, three on Friday afternoon and three on Saturday morning and here are their names and the titles of their talks.

Anthony G. O'Farrell (NUI Maynooth) Some approximation problems and theorems

Bodil Branner (Technical University of Denmark) Surgery in holomorphic dynamics

Ricardo Perez-Marco (Orsay, Paris & UCLA) Singular holomorphic dynamics

Shaun Bullett (Queen Mary & Westfield College, London) Dynamics of holomorphic correspondences

Jean-Christophe Yoccoz (Collège de France) *The modular* group and the Brjuno function

This was the second joint meeting with the London Mathematical Society. The first was held at Trinity College Dublin on March 21–22, 1986. The topic then was C^* -Algebras and Operator Theory and the local organizer was T. T. West.

On this occasion, the organization was delegated by the two societies to a committee consisting of A. Beardon and S. Bullett on the LMS side and D. Hurley and R. Timoney to provide input from the IMS.

The July 1998 issue of the London Mathematical Society Newsletter reports that there were a total of about 60 people attending the meeting and records also that the Chair was taken initially by J. M. Ball, FRS, President of the LMS. Later in the afternoon, D. Armitage, vice-President of the IMS took the chair and on Saturday morning the formal job of chairing the talks was

It featured objects, photographs, computer images, videos and interactive computer programs.
